International round table "The role of Eurasian trade unions and public organizations in shaping the ethics of artificial intelligence and digital transformation protocols"

Preamble: Trade unions have a key role to play in shaping the labor market of the future and striving for just transition to society where AI systems benefit everyone, no one is left behind, and the skills and competencies of individual workers are respected, and valued. Trade unions and civil society organizations must be able to assess the capabilities of their members as they enter the new world of work in the coming years, raise their awareness of the opportunities and risks associated with the quality and quantity of work, skills, and training, ethics and equity, health and safety, that the AI represents. In addition, trade unions need to develop mechanisms for effectively managing labor market transformations.

The purpose of the round table is to discuss the issues of regulating the use of AI in the Eurasian labor markets and to determine the zones of influence of trade unions and public organizations to form the ethics of labor relations in the context of digital transformations.

Topics for discussion:

Fair and just transition: the development of policies, standards and investment strategies in relation to the formation of new labor markets is currently fragmented not only within countries but also within individual industries. It is proposed to consider the possibilities of combining the efforts of sectoral and country trade unions and public organizations, creating mechanisms for interaction and exchange of experience, and subsequently developing common Eurasian approaches to the formation of labor markets.

Data collection and management: issues of regular and systematic testing of datasets for bias and discrimination and possible countermeasures to ensure fairness. The subtopic proposes to consider existing cases and possible mechanisms for delegating executive management accountability to data collection in relation to the data life

cycle, including the collection, use, storage, movement and “output” or sale of personal data to a collective of workers.

Skills and training: Basically, companies are focused on retraining and professional development of key employees. As part of the sub-topic, it is proposed to consider the possibility of including educational guarantees in collective agreements for all levels of workers, including low-skilled and older workers from risk groups. And also discuss the possibilities of combining the efforts of trade unions and public organizations to form common standards and assess qualifications on the Eurasian continent, as well as launch specialized training programs.
