

**RESOLUTION**  
**International People's Diplomacy Forum**  
**dedicated to the 5th anniversary of the Eurasian Peoples' Assembly**

June 3, 2022  
Moscow, Russia

On June 3, 2022, the International People's Diplomacy Forum dedicated to the 5th anniversary of the Eurasian Peoples' Assembly took place.

The issues of popularization and further development of people's diplomacy through innovative approaches and modern mechanisms of cultural, humanitarian, scientific, educational and business cooperation were put on the agenda.

The initiator and organizer of the Forum is the Eurasian Peoples' Assembly.

The program of the Forum consisted of 11 panel sessions on the history of the emergence and development of people's diplomacy, its various areas and the need to develop new approaches to solving the challenges and risks of the modern world, including platforms on the topics: "People's Diplomacy. Cultural and Humanitarian Cooperation", "People's Diplomacy: Traditions and Innovations", "The Role of Science Diplomacy in Supporting Sustainable Development", "Eurasian Partnership: New Protocols of Interaction", "Business Diplomacy: from People's Trust to the Trust of Economies", "People's Diplomacy. Youth Cooperation", "People's Diplomacy. Preservation of Historical Memory. Connection between Generations", "Diplomacy of Happiness", "Spiritual Culture: Man of the Future", "Information Diplomacy. Media and Social Networks", "Sport unites Nations".

More than 600 representatives from more than 45 countries of Europe, Asia, Africa and America took part in the Forum in a hybrid format, including: Austria, Azerbaijan, Angola, Armenia, Bahrain, Belarus, Benin, Bulgaria, Vietnam, Germany, Denmark, Djibouti, Egypt, Israel, India, Indonesia, Jordan, Iraq, Italy, Kazakhstan, Cambodia, China, Korea, Kyrgyzstan, Latvia, Lebanon, Libya, Lithuania, Morocco, Mongolia, Moldova, Nicaragua, UAE, Oman, Pakistan, Palestine, Panama, Russia, Serbia, Syria, Slovenia, Sudan, USA, Tajikistan, Uzbekistan, France, Czech Republic.

The plenary session "People's Diplomacy. New Mechanisms for Building a Shared Future" became the outcome of the Forum. It was attended by authoritative representatives of science, education, culture, business, statesmen and public figures, representatives of diplomatic missions from different countries.

The Forum participants noted that over the past five years the Eurasian Peoples' Assembly has become a credible international platform for interaction between civil society institutions and authorities.

Developing a broad partnership, the Assembly implements diverse projects through peacekeeping dialogue, people's diplomacy, and multifaceted cooperation with partners from different countries of Greater Eurasia.

This balanced line found support and development at all panel sessions and the plenary session of the Forum, held with the aim of further developing the role of people's diplomacy and expanding Eurasian integration.

Within the integration processes, relations between countries and peoples develop much more intensively than on a bilateral basis. Integration expands the space with favorable conditions for interaction not only through new members, but also through additional forms of international cooperation.

Humanitarian issues of modern civilization, which is losing its stability and security, both in the East and in the West, received a particular importance at the Forum. In this regard, for the first time at the conceptual level, the tasks of forming new approaches of civil society to decision-making concerning "everything", i.e. new protocols for interaction between the state and society, both at the country and international levels. Special attention was paid to the need for greater use of the potentials of science and culture, truth and morality, and, accordingly, the formation on their basis of public technologies of scientific and humanitarian diplomacy, which would allow, in connection with the existing threats of an ideological and worldview nature, to solve a global problem of the formation of a new value approach and humanitarian modernization in societies and states, as well as to ensure the stability and security of the world order and civilizational development opportunities. The participants of the Forum emphasized that the proposed ideas are of a strategic nature and should be transferred to the practical plane of structural decisions on the formation of socio-cultural models of the new world order.

The International People's Diplomacy Forum has become a confirmation of the relevance of holding the World Public Summit, initiated by the Eurasian Peoples' Assembly. People's diplomacy should strive to capture new trends in uniting people's forces, searching for reliable partners, new areas of activity, additional communication channels, actively expanding diplomatic relations, strengthening multilateral cooperation at the international level.

### **The Forum participants decided to:**

1. **Support** the annual World Public Summit.

2. **Develop** a Concept for the Humanitarian Modernization of Greater Eurasia for subsequent presentation at the World Public Summit.

3. **Work out** the issue on establishing structures for scientific and humanitarian diplomacy under the Eurasian Peoples' Assembly.

4. **Generalize** the experience of socio-cultural dynamics, practices and technologies of people's diplomacy of the countries of Greater Eurasia for further application of this experience in new protocols and models of interaction of the modern world.

5. **Develop** a concept for creating a single information space of Greater Eurasia.

6. **Use** in international public practice the potential of spiritual culture as a transformative vector for the development of man and society.

7. **Develop** people's diplomacy through modern mechanisms of business, scientific, educational, humanitarian cooperation, popularization of the best models of multilateral partnership of the international community.

8. **Develop** expert diplomacy by organizing the interaction of the international community with the expert community and think tanks in different countries.

9. **Promote** the preservation of the non-material culture of peoples, folk epic, language, customs, traditions that support ethno-cultural diversity and national identity.

10. **Pay** special attention to the development of youth cooperation in the Eurasian space.
